This is a summary of the City Council meeting held on Monday, September 28, 2009.

Mayor Mary Graves called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked the Clerk to call the roll. Mr. Baird was absent. Mr. Bennett moved to excuse Mr. Baird. Mrs. Campbell seconded the motion. The Clerk called the roll: Mr. Bennett, yes; Mrs. Campbell, yes; Mr. Fussner, yes; Mr. Ritzel, yes; Mr. Schweller, yes; Mayor Graves, yes. The motion carried 6-0 and Mr. Baird was excused.

Mrs. Campbell recommended a change to the minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of September 14, 2009, that the word "one" in the last sentence of the third to last paragraph on page 6 be changed to "a catalog." There being no additional corrections or additions to the prior minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of **September 14, 2009, Mr. Bennett moved they be approved as corrected.** Mrs. Campbell seconded the motion. The Clerk called the roll: Mr. Bennett, yes; Mrs. Campbell, yes; Mr. Fussner, yes; Mr. Ritzel, yes; Mr. Schweller, abstain; Mayor Graves, yes. The motion carried 5-0 with one abstention.

SPECIAL GUESTS/SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Rachel Barnes and Kaitlin Dumont from Girl Scout Troop 32410, presented their Silver Award Project to market fire and rescue markers (address plates that go on mailbox posts to increase visibility to emergency personnel) to both Bellbrook and Sugarcreek Township. They said the Silver Award, a voluntary project, in girl scouts is similar to the Eagle Scout award in boy scouts. The address plates will sell for \$12 each and, if a profit is realized, they will give it back to the Bellbrook Fire Department for providing the markers.

Beth Rumble, Assistant Director, Greene County Public Library, announced that the Greene County Public Library would have a 1 mill, 5-year, operating levy on the November 3 ballot. She explained that they were not asking for an increase even though their funding has been severely cut. She said that even with the passage of the operating levy they would have to cut back programs and operating hours.

Janet Harp, Sponsorship Manager, WPAFB, gave a video presentation on Wright Patterson's annual Tadoo event which will be held on June 25, 2010. She explained that they have a family area for which there has been an additional charge and they hoped to have civic partners in 2010 to sponsor that activity allowing it to be free of charge. She mentioned that the event itself, as well as parking, is free of charge.

Mayor Graves introduced Bronne Wilson, Chair of the City's Beautification Committee. Mrs. Wilson presented **Beautification Awards** to this year's recipients, a list of whom is attached to this record and made a part hereof. Mrs. Wilson thanked her committee and, in response to a question from Mayor Graves, said she had spearheaded this event for over 20 years. Mayor Graves thanked her for her service.


