Calls of Interest:

April 19 – 1726 hours Drug Violation

An officer was on patrol in an area of businesses on State Route 725. The officer observed a known drug user in a business. The person was acting suspicious. The officer checked on the subject's welfare. Further investigation revealed that the subject had possession of drug paraphernalia, heroin, and cocaine. She was arrested and later transported to the Greene County Jail

April 21 – 1553 hours Traffic Accident – No Injury

Officers were dispatched to a traffic accident on West Franklin Street. A driver was charged with ACDA.

April 21 - 2142 hours Traffic Stop – OVI Arrest

An officer stopped a vehicle for a moving violation on West Franklin Street. Further investigation led to the arrest of the driver for OVI.

April 23 - 1728 hours Dispute-Verbal

Officers were dispatched to a business on West Franklin Street on a disturbance. Further investigation revealed that customers were upset with another customer. All parties left without any further issues.

April 23 – 1816 hours DOA

Officers were dispatched along with Bellbrook Medics to an address on Woodedge Drive. After arrival, it was determined that a male subject was trying to work on an issue in his basement. The subject was attempted to be rescued, however he was deceased. The Greene County Coroner's Office responded to the scene. Preliminary investigation results reveal an accidental death by drowning.

April 23 – 2049 hours Telephone Harassment

An officer was dispatched to an address on North Field Drive. A complainant stated that she received several unwanted phone calls from a former friend. The subject was told not to call the complainant any more.

April 24 – 2244 hours Traffic Stop – OVI/Physical Control Arrest

Officers were dispatched to Sugar Bell Center on State Route 725 on a highly intoxicated subject leaving a local bar. Further investigation led to the arrest of the driver for Physical Control. She was later released to a friend.

An officer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation on State Route 725. Further investigation led to the arrest for OVI and having possession of a switch blade knife that was concealed. The subject was arrested and later transported to the Greene County Jail for incarceration.
