June 7 – 0549 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on State Route 725 for a suspicious person, who had fallen asleep in his vehicle while the engine was running. The driver's side window of the vehicle was open, but it took officers numerous times to wake up the subject. An odor of alcohol was coming from the vehicle and driver. The suspect was charged with OVI and transported to the Greene County Jail.

June 7 – 1426 hours

A complaint of a possible disturbance or physical fight was reported at a business in the Bellbrook Plaza. Investigation revealed that a verbal disagreement had taken place between two employees. One subject had punched and pushed over furniture inside the business. He was cited into XMC for Disorderly Conduct.

June 8 – 1328 hours

An officer was dispatched to the area of W Franklin Street where a cement truck had broken down. The officers stood by while the vehicle was moved from the roadway.

June 8 – 1501 hours

While on patrol, an officer observed a disabled vehicle on a trailer, with expired license plates in a driveway on Bledsoe Drive. Contact was made with the vehicle owner, who was given a 10-day notice to remove the disabled vehicle from the driveway.

June 8 – 1701hours

An officer was dispatched to South Linda Drive on an Identity Theft report. The complainant advised she had been contacted by her bank that 3 credit card accounts had been opened in her name, and charge were made to those cards. The report was assigned to the Detective.

June 9 – 1418 hours

An officer was dispatched to Firebird Drive on the report of a juvenile driving a golf cart in the street. The juvenile and her parents were located, and advised to cease the prohibited activity.

June 9 – 1717 hours

A resident on W Maple Street reported several items such as a City water meter, electricity meter, gas meter, and driveway had been spray painted by an unknown subject. Investigation revealed who the suspect was and he was subsequently cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Criminal Mischief.

June 10 – 2129 hours

A business owner on Lakeview Drive reported an employee was refusing to return a work truck and equipment. The employee was spoken to and advised he would be charged with Unauthorized Use of Property and Theft, if he did not return the property. Arrangements were made with the employee, who returned the truck and other equipment to the employer on June 13th.

June 11 – 2044 hours

Officers were dispatched to South Linda Drive on the report of an irate subject who was breaking and burning furniture. The caller advised that he had also been in a physical confrontation with the suspect. Investigation led to the arrest of suspect, who was charged with Domestic Violence and Assault. He was transported to the Greene County Jail to be incarcerated.

June 12 – 1652 hours

Officers were dispatched to Wilmington-Dayton Road on the report of a large tree blocking the North-bound traffic on Wilmington-Dayton Rd, causing a Traffic Hazard. Officers provided traffic control until the tree was removed by the Bellbrook Road Department.

June 12 – 2018 hours

A Hit & Run accident was reported in the parking lot of a business on State Route 725. The victim advised that a vehicle had backed up and struck his vehicle in the process. The suspect vehicle then drove off. The driver was later located, and cited into Court for Improper Starting or Backing and Leaving The Scene of an Accident.
