June 22 – 0915 hours

An officer was dispatched to an address on Marcia Drive on an Identity Theft Report. The victim had unauthorized charges on her debit card. Case is still under investigation.

June 24 – 1837 hours

Officers were dispatched to a house on N Linda Drive on the complaint of a burglary. Further investigation revealed that a relative of the victim had forced entry into the residence while he was not there. A small amount of money was stolen. The city prosecutor approved charges for Criminal Damaging, Criminal Trespass, and Theft. The suspect was found and admitted to the Detective that he did commit the offenses. It was also determined that the suspect is on probation through Montgomery County Adult Probation.

June 25 - 0156 hours

An officer was on patrol on Wilmington-Dayton Road when he stopped a subject for a speed violation. Further investigation led to the arrest of the driver for OVI.

June 25 - 1300 hours

Officers were dispatched to addresses on Clarkston Drive and Poston Drive. Damage was done by a vehicle to both yards including complete damage to a mailbox. A witness was able to give a license plate. Further investigation led to the identification of the driver of the vehicle in question. He was charged with Leaving the Scene of Accident and Criminal Damaging.
