Officers assisted Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a loud party with underage subjects. BPD officers assisted with identifying all subjects at the party.

Residents on Upper Hillside Drive reported a suspicious vehicle parked in front of a neighbor's home, who they believed to be out of town. Investigation the vehicle belonged to the neighbor who was back at home.
