November 1, 2015 – 2249 hours

A traffic stop on Wilmington-Dayton Road for a moving violation, led to the arrest of the 66-year old driver from Dayton for OVI. He was cited into XMC, and then released to a relative.

November 2, 2015 – 1507 hours

An officer was dispatched to South Lakeman Drive on the report of a suspicious person. Investigation revealed that the person was soliciting work for a tree trimming company.

November 3, 2015 – 1122 hours

A disabled vehicle was reported to be in the roadway on Wilmington-Dayton Road near Moss Oak Trail. Contact was made with the vehicle owner, who advised his vehicle had run out of gas. A relative was already on the way with fuel. The officer stood by until the vehicle cleared the area.

November 3, 2015 – 1408 hours

Officers were dispatched to an address on E Maple Street on the report of a disorderly subject. Investigation revealed a verbal argument had occurred between the complainant and an intoxicated relative. Officers were able to calm down all parties involved, and no further complaints were received.

November 3, 2015 – 1429 hours

A resident on Plantation Trail reported that her trash cans had been stolen and had last seen the trash cans two weeks prior to filing the report. There are no suspects at this time.

November 3, 2015 – 2343 hours

Officers were dispatched to Polo Trace Court on an intrusion alarm activation. Contact was made with a house sitter who advised that a canine may have caused the alarm to go off. Confirmed false alarm.

November 4, 2015 – 1453 hours

An officer was dispatched to South Main Street on the report of a truck that had spilled cement on the roadway. The Bellbrook Service Department was requested to respond to clean up. The complainant could not provide any information about the vehicle responsible for the spill.

November 6, 2015 – 1027 hours

A resident on Moss Oak Trail reported receiving a call advising she had won a large sum of money. In order to receive the money, the complainant was asked to get a money gram for \$652.00 and wire it to the caller. She then contacted the Bellbrook Police Department. The officer explained that this was a scam call, and investigation revealed that the phone call had come from the country of Nigeria.

November 6, 2015 – 1442 hours

A resident came to the Bellbrook Police Department to advise she had been receiving harassing phone calls from a caller who claimed to be working for a Collections Agency. Investigation revealed that the phone calls were a scam. The complainant was given advice about dealing with the caller, and told to notify the Ohio Attorney General's Office to report the scam.

November 6, 2015 – 1723 hours

An officer was dispatched to Brookwood Drive on the report of a subject blowing leaves into the roadway. Contact was made with the homeowner who was in the process of bagging the leaves. The officer explained the City Ordinance regarding leaves in the roadway to the homeowner. The officer then cleared the call.

November 6, 2015 – 1745 hours

A vehicle traveling Northbound on Wilmington-Dayton Road failed to maintain a clear distance ahead and struck a vehicle that was stopped to make a turn onto Ambridge Drive. The at-fault driver was cited into XMC.
