November 15, 2015 – 1942 hours

A traffic stop on Knob Hill Drive revealed that the driver of the vehicle had a suspended driver's license. The vehicle's registration was expired. During the stop, drug paraphernalia was found in the vehicle. The 32-year old male driver from Dayton was also wanted on a warrant from the Sugarcreek Township Police Department. The suspect was cited into Court for Drug Paraphernalia, Driving Under Suspension, and Expired Registration. He was taken into custody by the Sugarcreek Township Police Department.

November 15, 2015 – 2113 hours

An officer was dispatched to Kensington Drive on the report of a suspicious vehicle. The complainant advised that an unknown vehicle was parked in his driveway. Contact was made with the vehicle owner, who was leaving a neighbor's home and advised he accidentally parked in the wrong driveway.

Officers were dispatched to Old English Circle on the report of a possible breaking and entering in progress.
