April 10, 2016 – 2047 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for a moving violation. Investigation revealed that the 57-year old male was impaired. The subject was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated and Failure to Use Turn Signal.

April 11, 2016 – 1416 hours

An officer was dispatched to Marcia Drive on the complaint of a vehicle driving erratically in the area. Several complaints had been received in the days prior. The officer was able to locate the vehicle and the 21-year old driver from Bellbrook. The subject was advised of the complaints, and was issued a warning.

April 11, 2016 – 1812 hours

A ladies wallet was found at a business on West Franklin Street. After proper identification, the owner may claim the property at the Bellbrook Police Department.

April 12, 2016 – 1706 hours

While on routine patrol an officer came across two male subjects yelling at each other in a front yard on West Franklin Street. The officer was flagged down by one of the subjects. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature only and was resolved with the help of the officer.

April 13, 2016 – 1245 hours

A resident on Knob Hill Drive reported receiving a call from an unknown subject informing her that she had missed jury duty in Montgomery County and that a bond had been placed. The caller told the complainant that if she did not pay the bond she was subject to arrest. The officer explained that this is a known scam and not to provide any personal information or money to the caller.



April 14, 2016 – 0224 hours

Officers were dispatched to Possum Run Road on a domestic violence incident. Investigation revealed that the incident had taken place in Sugarcreek Township. The suspect had fled the scene. The victim was transported to the hospital for medical treatment. The 26-year old male suspect was located and arrested by Sugarcreek Township Police Department.

April 14, 2016 – 2250 hours

While on bike patrol an officer located an open door at a vacant business on West Franklin Street. The officer checked the interior and found no signs of criminal activity. The door was re-secured.

April 15, 2016 – 1018 hours

A resident on Portage Path reported that her credit card had been compromised and that there were fraudulent charges on her account. The bank was contacted and the victim's account was closed.

April 15, 2016 – 1443 hours

A South Lakeman Drive resident received calls regarding a criminal matter from a subject claiming to be a Lieutenant with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department. The victim was told to pay an amount of \$695.00 to take care of the issue. The officer explained that this was a scam phone call and not to provide the caller with any personal information or money.

April 15, 2016 – 2142 hours

Officers were dispatched to Ivy Crest Drive on the report of a fight in progress. Investigation revealed that no physical fight had taken place but that 4 juveniles had shown up at the complainant's residence wanting to fight his son. The suspects were located and apologized for their behavior. Contact was made with the juveniles' parents who were made aware of the incident.



April 16, 2016 – 0239 hours

An officer located an open garage door on Marcia Drive. Contact was made with the homeowner's brother who checked the garage to make sure nothing was missing and then closed the door.
