**April 17, 2016 – 0418 hours**

While on routine patrol an officer located an open garage door on West Franklin Street. Contact was made with the homeowner who checked to make sure nothing was missing from the garage and then closed the garage door.

**April 18, 2016 – 0800 hours**

Officers were dispatched to Beryl Drive on the report of a burglary alarm activation. Upon the officers' arrival the homeowners advised that everything was ok. Confirmed false alarm.

**April 18, 2016 – 2019 hours**

A domestic dispute between a mother and son was reported on East Franklin Street. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. The parties were separated for the night.

**April 19, 2016 – 0005 hours**

Officers were dispatched to South Linda Drive on the report of domestic dispute. The dispute between father and son had been verbal in nature. The parties were separated and the son was given a ride to his mother's home.

**April 19, 2016 – 1851 hours**

Officers were dispatched to West Franklin Street on a Criminal Damaging complaint. The complainant advised that a disgruntled contractor had intentionally spilled paint in his driveway. The case was referred to the City Prosecutor.

**April 19, 2016 – 2229 hours**

Officers were dispatched to Amy Brooke Circle on an intrusion alarm activation. The interior and exterior of the home checked ok.



**April 19, 2016 – 2339 hours**

Ohio State Highway Patrol came in contact with a subject with an active warrant from the Bellbrook Police Department. The 30-year old wanted male from Dayton was picked up and transported to the Greene County Jail.

**April 20, 2016 – 1225 hours**

A traffic accident with injuries was reported on Upper Bellbrook Road. The 22- year old driver at fault from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for failure to maintain Assured Clear Distance Ahead.

**April 20, 2016 – 2225 hours**

A resident of Possum Run Court reported that a small dog without a collar or tags had run into his backyard and home. The animal was taken to Animal Control in Xenia.

**April 22, 2016 – 0831 hours**

A bus driver dropping of a child on Vemco Drive advised that someone had passed the school bus while its stop sign and lights were activated. The suspect was located and cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to stop for a School Bus.

**April 22, 2016 – 1906 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Pavilion Lane on a barking dog complaint. The animal had stopped barking prior to the officer's arrival. The officer returned to normal patrol.

**April 23, 2016 – 0942 hours**

A traffic accident was reported on State Route 725. A vehicle traveling eastbound had gone off the roadway and through the yard of a business. The vehicle then left the scene. Several witnesses observed the accident and the driver. Officers responded to the driver's home and found visible damage to the accident vehicle. The 79-year old suspect from Bellbrook was



found to be inebriated and taken into custody. He was charged with Failure to Control, Leaving the Scene of an Accident, and Operating a Vehicle while Impaired.

**April 23, 2016 – 1008 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Vineyards Way on a panic alarm activation. Upon arrival the officer made contact with a contractor working on the home, who advised he had accidentally set off the alarm.
