June 5, 2016 – 0002 hours

An officer was dispatched to South East Street on the report of a disturbance. Upon arrival, the officer located a subject yelling in his garage while working on his vehicle, and causing a lot of noise. The 34-year male from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Disorderly Conduct.

June 5, 2016 – 0106 hours

While on bike patrol an officer heard loud music coming from a residence on Sugarwood Circle. Contact was made with the homeowner who was ordered to down the music. No further problems.

June 5, 2016 – 0126 hours

A traffic stop on Eckworth Drive for an Unsafe Vehicle revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 22-year old driver from Dayton also told the officer that the vehicle did not have back brakes. The officer ordered the driver to park the vehicle, and cited him into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

June 5, 2016 – 2300 hours

A traffic stop on Wilmington-Dayton Road revealed that the 28-year old driver from Bellbrook did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

June 6, 2016 – 0116 hours

While traveling Eastbound on West Franklin Street an officer observed a vehicle in front of him go left of center several times. The vehicle was stopped and investigation revealed that the driver was experiencing a medical issue. A Bellbrook Medic was dispatched and treated the driver.



June 6, 2016 – 0137 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for a Speed violation. Upon further investigation, marijuana was located inside the vehicle. The 20-year old suspect from Beavercreek was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Possession of Marijuana and Speed.

June 6, 2016 – 1746 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on State Route 725 for an intrusion alarm activation. The business was found to be secure and there were no signs of criminal activity. False alarm.

June 6, 2016 – 2122 hours

While on preventative patrol a subject drove by an officer and yelled vulgar language to him. Minutes later when the officer was on a traffic stop, the same subject drove by again and yelled profanities at the officer a second time. The suspect was identified as a 25-year old male from Bellbrook and issued a criminal citation for Disorderly Conduct.

June 7, 2016 – 0247 hours

A resident on Hoop Court reported hearing what she thought was someone trying to get into her house. Officers checked the exterior and interior of the home and found no signs of anyone.

June 7, 2016 – 1813 hours

A resident on Wentworth Village Drive reported that an unknown subject had taken out a loan in his name and now a debt collection agency was attempting to recover money for that loan. The victim advised that his Social Security number was compromised a few years ago. The collection agency advised they will close their case after the police report was filed.



June 7, 2016 – 1851 hours

A resident on North Belleview Drive reported that an unknown subject had entered his vehicle and taken \$10.00 in change out of it. The complainant advised that the vehicle had been unlocked. Report taken.

June 8, 2016 – 2121 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 23-year old driver from Kettering did not have a valid driver's license. He was not wearing his seatbelt at the time of the stop. The subject was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Seatbelt Required and given a verbal warning for No Front License Plate.

June 8, 2016 – 2219 hours

While on bike patrol an officer located a suspicious vehicle at the park on East South Street. Contact was made with the owner who was told the park was closed and to leave the area.

June 9, 2016 – 0125 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington Pike for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 30-year old female driver from Dayton did not have a valid driver's license. She was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension. Further investigation led to drugs found in the vehicle that belonged to a 45-year old passenger from Bellbrook. He was issued a criminal citation for Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Criminal Tools.

June 9, 2016 – 1111 hours

A resident on Little Sugarcreek Road reported receiving 5 phone calls from someone claiming to work for the Internal Revenue Service. The officer explained to the complainant that this was a known fraud and someone trying to get money from her. She was advised to ignore and future calls.



June 9, 2016 – 1721 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a dog running loose in the area of South Main Street. Contact was made with the owner, who had been given previous warnings for the same issue. The officer cited the animal owner into Xenia Municipal Court for Dog at Large.

June 9, 2016 – 2313 hours

A loud music complaint was received on East Franklin Street. The owner made contact with the responsible party who apologized to the officer and turned down the music.

June 10, 2016 – 0058 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road after he observed the vehicle go over the center line. Investigation revealed that 2 underage passengers in the vehicle had consumed alcohol. A 16-year old male from Spring Valley and a 17-year old male from Bellbrook were cited into Greene County Juvenile Court for Underage Consumption.

June 10, 2016 – 2027 hours

An officer was dispatched to Bledsoe Drive on the report of subjects involved in door-to-door sales. The officer located the subjects who were attempting to sell vacuum cleaners. They did not have a solicitor's permit. Both subjects from Dayton were issued written warnings for Soliciting without a Permit and ordered to cease their activity. They were explained how to obtain a Solicitor's Permit for the City of Bellbrook.

June 11, 2016 – 0233 hours

An officer located an open garage door on Sugar Leaf Drive. Contact was made with the homeowner who advised he forgot to close it. After checking the garage to ensure nothing was missing he secured the door.



June 11, 2016 – 0727 hours

An officer was dispatched to Caudill Drive where a construction trailer was parked on the roadway and blocking a driveway. Contact was made with the owner of the trailer, who had it removed from the roadway.

June 11, 2016 – 1447 hours

An officer assisted the Sugarcreek Police Department with a traffic crash on Waynesville Road. The officer provided traffic control until no longer needed.

June 11, 2016 – 1826 hours

A traffic stop for a Speed violation was conducted on West Franklin Street. Investigation revealed that the 28-year old driver from Dayton, who did not have a valid driver's license, was impaired. The vehicle registration was also expired. The suspect was taken into custody and cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated, Driving under Suspension, Speed, and Expired Registration. The subject was then released to a relative.

June 11, 2016 – 2337 hours

Officers were dispatched to Ridgetop Drive on the complaint of a loud party. Upon arrival, the officer could hear loud talking, yelling of profanities, and very loud music at the residence. The homeowner was advised of the complaint and told to keep the noise down. After a few minutes officers were dispatched back to the same address and again the homeowner was told to keep the noise down. Officers were dispatched to the same address for a third time fifteen minutes later and cited the homeowner into Xenia Municipal Court for Disorderly Conduct by Disturbing the Peace. Officers advised that the party had to be terminated and for all visitors to leave.
