July 10, 2016 – 0223 hours

An officer was dispatched to North West Street on the report of a suspicious person. Investigation revealed that the 50-year old male from Dayton was playing the Pokemon Go game.

July 10, 2016 – 0246 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a stray dog on West Franklin Street near North Lakeman Drive. The dog did not have a collar or tags. The officer transported the dog to Greene County Animal Control in Xenia.

July 10, 2016 – 0722 hours

While assisting an officer on a traffic stop on Wilmington Pike, the backup officer could hear a vehicle's engine rapidly accelerating from behind the cruisers. The vehicle passed the cruisers at a high rate of speed, and came within inches from striking the officer. The driver, a 25-year old male from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Approaching a Stationary Emergency Vehicle without Caution, Reckless Operation of a Vehicle, and Failure to Signal Turn.

July 10, 2016 – 0942 hours

An officer assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with traffic control on Wilmington Pike where a pickup truck's rear wheels had come off. The officer stood by until no longer needed.

July 10, 2016 – 0948 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 41-year old male from Kettering was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Reinstate Driver's License.



July 10, 2016 – 1018 hours

An officer assisted a subject from Sylvania, Ohio, who had locked her keys in her vehicle on South Lakeman Drive. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

July 10, 2016 – 1500 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Washington Mill Road for a speeding violation. Investigation revealed that the 23-year old male driver from Spring Valley did not have a valid driver's license. He was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Speed.

July 11, 2016 – 0134 hours

While on routine patrol an officer observed 5 juveniles on North Linda Drive. As the officer approached the juveniles, they took off running towards Shadowleaf Drive. Sugarcreek Township Police officers assisted in locating the juveniles. One of the juveniles admitted to officers that they had been in the process of putting silly string and confetti on a friend's house. All juveniles' parents were contacted and informed that they would be issued a Curfew Violation warning. The victim did not want to pursue charges for Criminal Mischief.

July 11, 2016 – 1518 hours

An officer was dispatched to Planation Trail on a Criminal Damage report. The complainant advised that unknown subjects had struck her mailbox.

July 11, 2016 – 1633 hours

An officer was dispatched to Washington Mill Road where a subject had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

July 11, 2016 – 1924 hours

A resident on Hess Road advised that he had received several threatening text messages from a former roommate. Contact was made with the 25-year old male suspect from Centerville



who was ordered to cease all contact with the complainant and issued a criminal trespass warning.

July 12, 2016 – 0746 hours

An officer found a dog running loose on Bellemeade Drive near Plantation Trail. He was able to corral the dog which had a dog collar and tags. The owner was contacted and picked up the dog.

July 13, 2016 – 2026 hours

A suspicious vehicle was reported on East Franklin Street. Upon locating the vehicle, it was learned that the driver was having car issues. The vehicle was removed from the roadway.

July 14, 2016 – 1138 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on State Route 725 near Sackett Wright Park after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 34-year old male from Dayton was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Reinstate Driver's License.

July 14, 2016 – 1157 hours

An attempted break-in was reported on Upper Bellbrook Road. Unknown subjects had attempted to pry off a section of a wall panel underneath a window. Subjects did not gain access to the building. The report is under investigation.

July 14, 2016 – 1340 hours

An officer was dispatched to Bellbrook Plaza for a welfare check on a dog that was locked inside of a vehicle. The officer observed that the animal was not in distress and that the owner had left water for it inside the vehicle. Contact was made with the owner who was advised of the complaint.



July 14, 2016 – 1430 hours

Officers were dispatched to Portage Path Drive on a burglary alarm activation. The residence was checked and found to be secure. False alarm.

July 14, 2016 – 1812 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a low hanging tree branch over the roadway on Maxwell Drive near South Belleview Drive. The officer remained on the scene until the Bellbrook Service Department arrived to cut the branch down.

July 14, 2016 – 2200 hours

An officer assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a report of a suspicious vehicle at the Ron Kehl Park on Sonoma Court. Contact was made with the occupant who advised she was there to play the Pokemon Go game. The female was advised that she could not be in the park after dark hours. She left the area without further incident.

July 15, 2016 – 0045 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Alex Bell Road after a routine registration checked revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 31-year old male from Cincinnati was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

July 15, 2016 – 1340 hours

An officer was dispatched to Moss Oak Trail on an Identity Theft report. The complainant advised that an unknown subject had used her personal information to open a line of credit. She was not out of any money at this time. She was given information about identity theft and how to protect herself from any further fraud.

July 15, 2016 – 1523 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Old English Circle. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. The parties separated for the evening.



July 15, 2016 – 2255 hours

While on bike patrol an officer located a vehicle parked at Eagle Land Park. Contact was made with two subjects who advised they were playing the Pokemon Go game. They were advised that they could not be in the park after dark hours and both left without further incident.

July 16, 2016 – 0433 hours

An officer located a running vehicle behind a business on State Route 725 with the driver passed out behind the wheel. The vehicle was in neutral. An open bottle of whiskey was observed in plain view. The 33-year old male suspect from Bellbrook was taken into custody and cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated and Open Container. He was later released to a friend.

July 16, 2016 – 1219 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on North Main Street after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 18-year old male from Kettering was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

July 16, 2016 – 1240 hours

A protection order violation was reported on South Main Street. The complainant advised that after this department had arrested the suspect on July 4th for violating a protection order, the suspect was still incarcerated at the Greene County Jail. The complainant further advised that while the suspect was incarcerated he had made 14 calls to her between July 11th and July 16th. The jail was contacted and personnel immediately put a block on the complainant's phone number. The suspect was served his additional charges of Violation of a Protection Order and Menacing by Stalking at the Greene County Jail.
