September 18, 2016 – 1546 hours

A hit & run accident was reported on Caudell Drive. A legally parked car was struck by an unknown vehicle causing damage to tail light and bumper. No suspect at this time.

September 18, 2016 – 1708 hours

Officers were dispatched to Sable Ridge Drive on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that a pet caregiver had accidentally set off the alarm. This was confirmed with the homeowner.

September 19, 2016 – 0254 hours

An officer located an open door at a business on West Franklin Street. The business checked ok, and the door was re-secured.

September 19, 2016 – 0902 hours

Officers were dispatched Sugar Maple Place on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that a cleaning crew had accidentally set off the alarm.

September 19, 2016 – 1525 hours

A resident on Sable Ridge Drive reported that unknown subject(s) had used her personal information to apply for four credit cards. The credit cards were never mailed to her. The victim was given advice to protect her from any future identity theft.

September 19, 2016 – 1636 hours

A vehicle stopped behind a school bus unloading children, backed up to allow for more room between the school bus and her car. As the driver backed up, she struck a vehicle behind her, causing damage to the other vehicle. Further investigation revealed that the 18-year old female driver had passed a school bus while discharging students, prior to being in the accident. The driver at-fault was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Improper Backing, and Failure to Stop for a School Bus.



September 19, 2016 – 1846 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the driver was impaired and did not have a valid driver's license. The 19-year old male from Kettering was charged with Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated, Driving under Suspension, and No Front License Plate.

September 20, 2016 – 0628 hours

Officers were dispatched to Woodedge Drive on the report of an alarm activation. Upon arrival they found an open door at the residence. Contact was made with the homeowner who was experiencing a medical emergency. A Bellbrook Medic was dispatched.

September 20, 2016 – 1738 hours

A neighbor dispute was reported on Liam Court. The complainant advised that his neighbor was having some yard work done, and had parked his truck in the complainant's front yard, possible driving over a sprinkler system. Upon the officer's arrival, the vehicle was moved out of the yard, and the neighbor advised that he would take care of any possible damage to the sprinkler system.

September 20, 2016 – 2229 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for a moving violation. Investigation revealed that the 49-year old driver from Bellbrook was impaired. He was charged with Operating a Vehicle while Intoxicated and Marked Lanes.

September 21, 2016 – 1944 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on State Route 725 for Expired Registration. Investigation revealed that the 35-year old driver from Springfield did not have a valid driver's license. She was also wanted on two warrants from the Clark County Sheriff's Department. The suspect was in possession of prescription medication that did not belong to her. The female was taken



into custody and charged with Possession of Drugs, Driving under Suspension, and transported to the Greene County Jail.

September 22, 2016 – 1617 hours

A resident on Hillcrest Drive reported being harassed by phone by a person known to her. Contact was made with the suspect who was told to cease all contact with the complainant.

September 23, 2016 – 0332 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on North Main Street on the report of a suspicious vehicle with a subject walking around it. Upon arrival it was learned that the vehicle had a flat tire and the driver was trying to fix it in the parking lot.

September 23, 2016 – 0819 hours

Officers were dispatched to the Bellbrook Plaza on an alarm activation. Investigation revealed that the business owner had recently installed a new alarm system and an employee had accidentally set it off.

September 23, 2016 – 1346 hours

An accident was reported in the parking lot of a business on State Route 725. Both vehicles had minor damage. Both drivers exchanged information for insurance purposes.

September 23, 2016 – 2038 hours

A suspicious vehicle was reported driving very slowly on Moss Oak Trail. Investigation revealed that it was a pizza delivery driver attempting to locate an address.

September 23, 2016 – 2327 hours

Loud music was reported on Hess Road. Upon the officer's arrival he could hear music coming from a residence. He made contact with the homeowner and told him to turn down the music.
