### **February 12, 2017 – 0021 hours**

A resident reported that someone rang her doorbell but that there had not been anyone at her door. Officers checked the area but were unable to locate anyone.

### **February 13, 2017 – 1409 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on East Franklin Street after a routine registration check revealed that the 34-year old male driver from Spring Valley did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

### **February 13, 2017 – 1513 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for a Speed violation. Investigation revealed that the 20-year old male driver from Middletown did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Speed.

### **February 13, 2017 – 1926 hours**

A resident on Rosecrest Drive reported that she was being harassed on social media and through phone calls. The suspect was contacted and ordered to cease all communication with the complainant.

### **February 14, 2017 – 1437 hours**

A resident on Moss Oak Drive reported that during the night before, someone rang his doorbell multiple times and had knocked on a window but that no one had been at his door. There were no signs of any damage or of who may have been responsible.



**February 14, 2017 – 0451 hours**

Officers were dispatched to Sheffield Drive on the report of a burglary alarm activation. The residence checked secure. False alarm.

**February 14, 2017 – 1312 hours**

A neighbor dispute was reported on West Sudbury Court. The complainant advised that his neighbor repeatedly plays loud music during the midnight hours. After officers made contact with the suspect, the 23-year old male sent harassing text messages to the complainant. Officers again made contact with the suspect and advised him he would be cited into Court if he did not cease his harassment and disorderly conduct.

**February 15, 2017 – 1430 hours**

While on routine patrol, an officer located a car alarm going off on a parked vehicle on West Franklin Street. The vehicle checked secure. Contact was made with the owner, who turned off the alarm.

**February 16, 2017 – 0221 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on Mill Pond Drive after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 35-year old male suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under a Child Support Suspension.

**February 16, 2017 – 1150 hours**

A female reported that a subject had yelled derogatory comments at her while she was in the parking lot of a business on State Route 725. The female had a protection order from the Greene County Domestic Relations Court in place against the 23-year old male suspect from Bellbrook. Officers located the suspect the next day and he was taken into custody and charged with Violation of a Protection Order. The suspect was transported to the Greene County Jail.



**February 16, 2017 – 1501 hours**

Officers were dispatched to West Franklin Street near Little Sugarcreek Road on the report of a vehicle that had struck a guard rail. Investigation revealed that the driver had a medical emergency and was transported to the hospital by the Bellbrook Fire Department.

**February 16, 2017 – 1832 hours**

A domestic dispute was reported on Lakeview Drive. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature without any physical violence. One of the involved parties had already left the scene before the officers' arrival. Report taken.

**February 17, 2017 – 0037 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Upon contact with the driver, the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Further investigation led to the 21-year old female driver from Waynesville being cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Drug Abuse and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. She was given a verbal warning for Loud Muffler.

**February 17, 2017 – 1030 hours**

A resident on Bledsoe Drive reported that he had observed an unknown male driving a blue-colored pickup truck stop in front of his residence and take pictures of his home. The complainant advised that this had happened approximately five times since last summer. The officer told the complainant to contact the police department immediately should he see the vehicle again.

**February 17, 2017 – 1036 hours**

A resident on Tampico Trail reported that a neighbor keeps moving her trash cans. Contact was made with the neighbor who was told to stop the activity.



**February 17, 2017 – 1136 hours**

Officers were dispatched to Whites Drive on a burglary alarm activation. Upon the officers' arrival, the homeowner advised that he had accidentally set off the alarm.

**February 18, 2017 – 1715 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Sugar Run Trail on the report of a suspicious occupied vehicle. The officer located the vehicle and made contact with the driver who advised he was waiting for his girlfriend.
