February 19, 2017 – 0256 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located an occupied suspicious vehicle at a business on Wilmington-Dayton Road. Investigation revealed that the vehicle had a flat tire, and the driver was waiting for a ride.

February 19, 2017 – 0337 hours

An officer located an open door to a business on West Franklin Street. The owner was notified. The building was checked and re-secured.

February 19, 2017 – 1600 hours

A business on West Franklin Street reported a possible theft of merchandise. Investigation led to the 35-year old female suspect from Xenia being Criminally Trespassed from the business. No charges filed.

February 19, 2016 – 1831 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Possum Run Road. Investigation led to the arrest of a 15-year old female for Domestic Violence. She was transported to the Greene County Juvenile Detention Center.

February 20, 2017 – 0417 hours

Officers were dispatched to Vemco Drive on a loud noise complaint. Upon arrival they located a subject working on his vehicle in the driveway. He was ordered to cease his activity until the morning hours.



February 20, 2017 – 1221 hours

An unattended recreational fire was reported on Vemco Drive. Officers requested the assistance of the Bellbrook Fire Department to extinguish the fire.

February 20, 2017 – 1621 hours

A resident on Bellemead Drive reported that he had attempted to purchase a dog online and had wired money from a business in Beavercreek to the seller in Alabama. The seller then requested another \$1000.00 to be wired to an address in a different state, to ship the animal. The complainant became suspicious and confronted the seller who immediately hung up on the complainant. The complainant was referred to the Beavercreek Police Department to investigate the fraud.

February 22, 2017 – 0100 hours

Officers located an open door at a building on Upper Bellbrook Road. The interior of the building was checked without any signs of criminal activity. The door was re-secured.

February 22, 2017 – 1529 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 41-year old male driver from Xenia did not have a valid driver's license. He was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for two counts of Driving under Suspension and a Display of Vehicle Registration violation.

February 22, 2017 – 1822 hours

A girl's bicycle was found at McGee Park on Little Sugarcreek. The bicycle was stored at the police department. After proper identification the owner may pick up the bicycle.

February 22, 2017 – 1830 hours

A 9-1-1 hang up was received from Big Tree Road. Upon contact with the caller, he advised he had accidentally called 9-1-1 when trying to check his voicemail.



February 22, 2017 – 2128 hours

A resident on Regent Park Drive reported a possible burglary in process after hearing noises in her basement. Officers checked the interior of the home and did not locate anyone. There were no signs of any criminal activity.

February 23, 2017 – 0104 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 30-year old female driver from Centerville was impaired, and did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was taken into custody and cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence, Driving under Suspension, No Operator's License, Drug Abuse, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and No Rear License Plate Light.

February 23, 2017 – 1606 hours

An officer was dispatched to a business on State Route 725 where a female had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

February 24, 2017 – 0408 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Investigation led to the arrest of the 25-year old driver from Xenia for Drug Abuse, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Open Container, and Defective Muffler.

February 24, 2107 – 1054 hours

A traffic accident was reported on Maple Leaf Court. A vehicle backing out of a driveway struck a vehicle parked in the roadway. The driver at-fault, a 23-year old female from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Improper Backing.

February 25, 2017 – 1832 hours

An officer was dispatched to Hess Road on a 9-1-1 hang up. Upon investigation it was learned that a small child had been playing with a phone and accidentally called 9-1-1.



February 25, 2017 – 2222 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Upon contact with the driver, a 20-year old male from Kettering, the officer could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The suspect turned over the marijuana to the officer and was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Drug Abuse.
