July 2, 2017 – 1204 hours

Vandalism was reported on Kensington Drive. Unknown subject(s) had spray-painted images on the City sidewalk. The Bellbrook Service Department was notified to remove the images.

July 2, 2017 – 1640 hours

Officers were dispatched to Shore Drive on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed a construction worker had accidentally set off the alarm.

July 2, 2017 – 1735 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located an open gate at a business on Washington Mill Road. The gate was malfunctioning. A key holder was notified and responded to correct the problem.

July 2, 2017 – 1930 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for a moving violation. A passenger in the vehicle lied to the officer about his identity. The subject was taken into custody for Obstructing Official Business. After learning the subject's true identity, investigation revealed that the 35-year old male from Springfield was wanted on a warrant from the Greene County Sheriff's Department. The male was transported to the Greene County Jail. The driver of the vehicle, a 31-year old male from Springfield did not have a valid driver's license. He was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

July 2, 2017 – 1954 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Knob Hill Drive. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. No charges filed.

July 3, 2017 – 0141 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with an attempted burglary on Washington Mill Road. The suspect was located and taken into custody. Officers remained on the scene until no longer needed.



July 4, 2017 – 0138 hours

Officers were dispatched to Sugarcreek Drive on the report of suspicious juveniles that dropped a bicycle in the front yard of the complainant's residence. The area was checked but officers were unable to locate the juveniles. The orange Mongoose bicycle was seized and stored at the Bellbrook Police Department.

July 4, 2017 – 0629 hours

An officer was dispatched to Mission Lane on the report of two raccoons that were stuck in a plastic crate. The officer was able to release the animals without any problems.

July 4, 2017 – 0730 hours

Domestic Violence was reported on Hillcrest Drive. Investigation led to the arrest of a 54-year old male for Domestic Violence and Assault.

July 4, 2017 – 1318 hours

A dog at large was reported on Lakeview Drive. An officer was able to catch the canine that did not have a collar or tags. The canine was picked up by Greene County Animal Control.

July 4, 2017 – 1459 hours

A traffic accident was reported on West Franklin Street where a vehicle was rear-ended. The driver at-fault, a 17-year old female from Bellbrook did not have a valid driver's license. She was cited into Greene County Juvenile Court for Driving under Suspension and Failure to Maintain Assured Clear Distance.

July 4, 2017 – 1708 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle after a routine registration check revealed that the driver, a 26-year old male from Kettering, did not have a valid driver's license. Further investigation revealed that the subject was impaired. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence, and Driving under Suspension.



July 4, 2017 – 1851 hours

Officers responded to West South Street on a burglary alarm activation. False alarm.

July 4, 2017 – 2156 hours

A resident on Von Hovel Court was given a warning about setting off fireworks.

July 5, 2017 – 0028 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located two juveniles walking on West Franklin Street near Little Sugarcreek Road. Contact was made with the juveniles' parents, who were advised of the curfew violation. The 12-year old boys were picked up by a parent.

July 5, 2017 – 1210 hours

A resident on Tennyson Drive reported that she observed two juveniles attempting to enter a neighbor's residence by checking for any unlocked doors or windows. The juveniles took off running after observing the complainant. The suspects could not be located. The property owner was contacted.

July 5, 2017 – 1804 hours

While patrolling the area on Bonniedale Drive an officer observed a subject involved in door-to-door sales. The subject was advised of the City Ordinance and given a warning for Soliciting without a Permit.

July 5, 2017 – 2229 hours

A traffic accident was reported behind a business on West Franklin Street where a 26-year old female from Dublin, California, lost control of her vehicle and struck a utility pole. The driver was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Control.

July 5, 2017 – 2311 hours

A disturbance was reported on Ryder Court. A 35-year old male who approached officers upon their arrival, was highly intoxicated. The subject was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Disorderly Conduct by Public Intoxication. A 15-year old male who was involved in the



altercation was also intoxicated. The juvenile was taken into custody and transported to the Greene County Juvenile Detention Center on a probation violation.

July 6, 2017 – 1509 hours

An officer responded to Vemco Drive on behalf of the Bellbrook Zoning Department on the complaint of an inoperable vehicle in the roadway with expired vehicle registration. The owner was contacted and issued a 10-day notification to correct the problem.

July 6, 2017 – 2147 hours

A resident on Hess Road reported that her prescription medication had been stolen. No suspect information.

July 7, 2017 – 1331 hours

A theft of two American flags was reported on Little Sugarcreek Road. No suspect information.

July 7, 2017 – 1451 hours

An officer assisted to Bellbrook Fire Department with providing traffic control on West Franklin Street as they took care of a tree that was on fire.

July 8, 2017 – 1038 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on West Franklin Street on the report of a female who appeared to be in distress. Officers located the subject who advised that she was in need of transportation to get to Middletown. Investigation revealed that the 32-year old female was wanted on a warrant from the Dayton Police Department. The subject was taken into custody and transferred to a Dayton Officer.

July 8, 2017 – 1613 hours

An officer responded to Lynlee Drive at the request of the Miami Township Police Department to make contact with a resident whose Social Security card had been found at the Dayton Mall. Contact was made.



July 8, 2017 – 2245 hours

While on routine patrol on West Maple Street an officer came across an occupied parked car with an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Contact was made with the occupants. Investigation led to a 26-year old male from Spring Valley being cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Drug Abuse and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
