July 16, 1137 hours

An officer responded to 1723 Kensington Dr on a truck blocking the roadway. The vehicle was moved without incident.

July 16, 1915 hours

Resident on Lakeview Dr called to ask officers check on her husband who had reportedly called (while drinking/driving) and made threats to harm himself. Officers located the driver and made a stop. Officers determined there was no issue with his sobriety or with harming himself. The caller was advised and thanked officers.

July 16, 2038

Units responded to the area of Chablis Ct. regarding a suspicious man running through the neighborhood. Officers located the man who stated he was jogging and got lost. Report made.

July 17, 1919 hours

Resident on Kensington Dr called to report an unknown man who made threats to her over the phone. Homeowner advised a man with an "Indian" accent called and told her to come outside or he would set her home on fire. An officer called the number back on her home phone but the number was out of service. The resident advised she hadn't used this land line in years. The residence was added to our daily house checks.

July 18, 1433

An Officer was asked to make entry into their locked vehicle on S. East St. Entry was made.

July 18, 1518

Officers were dispatched to 4301 State Route 725 on a child locked in a vehicle. The infant was found to be sitting in her child seat in the backseat after the car was accidentally locked. Officers were able to make entry into the vehicle. There was no harm to the infant.



July 19, 0854

On open garage door was called into police on S. Lakeman. Officers checked the garage and home. The home was found to be secure. The homeowner was contacted and advised.

July 19, 1228

Officers responded to Kensington Dr on a burglary alarm. Upon arrival, officers spoke with the homeowner who advised he accidentally set it off by mistake.

July 19, 2217

Officers were dispatched into the area of Beechwood Dr reference a reckless vehicle. Officers checked the area and the vehicle was gone.

July 20, 0412

Officers were called to Spring Creek Cir on a suicidal subject. Officers made contact with the person in question and found her to be alert and sober. She was in an argument earlier with a subject but never made and threats to harm herself. Officers confirmed her story with subjects on Spring Creek Cir. She thanked officers for checking on her.

July 20, 1637

An Officer responded to Rosecrest Dr for a vehicle unlock. The officer was able to gain entry.

July 21, 0800-0910 hours

Three calls for road obstructions. All three calls involved trees that had fallen into the street after strong winds. The Service Department assisted in clearing the roadways.

July 21, 1544

An Officer responded to Dot's reference a lockout. The officer was able to gain access for the vehicle's owner.



July 21, 2145
