August 5, 2017 – 1153 hours

An officer responded to Locus Bend Drive where a man from Beavercreek had locked his keys in his car. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

August 7, 2017 – 1809 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on East Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 30-year old driver from Dayton did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension, No Seatbelt, and No Front License Plate.
