August 12, 0008 hours

Officers responded to the 7000 block of Wilmington Dr on a multiple vehicle crash. Two drivers cited for OVI and other offenses.

August 12, 1115 hours

Units responded to Sable Ridge Dr on an intrusion alarm. The alarm was accidentally set off by people within the home.

August 13, 0142 hours

Officer initiated contact with a juvenile at Franklin and Little Sugarcreek. The juvenile advised she was upset and went for a walk. The juvenile was escorted home by police without incident.

August 13, 0439 hours

Police responded to W. Maple on a report of loud music. The homeowner was advised of the complaint and turned down the music. There were no further complaints.

August 13, 1022 hours

Police were called to Weller Dr on a lockout. The officer was able to gain access to the vehicle for the owner.

August 13, 1920

Units were called into the area of Hess Rd on a report of a dog at large. Units were able to capture the animal and return it the proper owner.

August 13, 2306

Units responded to W. Franklin on a report of a loud noise that came from within the home. Units checked the residence and found everything to be in order.



August 14, 1946

An officer responded to Wilmington-Dayton Rd on a report of a juvenile throwing an object at his car. Officers spoke with the juvenile and determined it to be a cherry from a nearby tree. The vehicle owner asked that we talk to the juvenile to make sure they do not repeat this action. Officers spoke with the juvenile and cleared the call.

August 15, 0607

An officer was sent to the area of Mill Pond on a report of susp. people. Officer made contact with several subjects; ID'd them and sent them out of the area without incident.

August 15, 1605

Units responded to Sable Ridge on alarm activation. Upon arrival, units found the residence secure. Units confirmed a false alarm with the alarm company.

August 16, 1119

An officer was called to the area of Dot's on a call of a small child being unsecured in the front cab of a pickup truck. An officer made contact with the driver who advised he drove a short distance in the parking lot with his toddler without a safety belt. He apologized and said he would not do it again.

August 16, 1907

Units responded to Penn Station on a 911 hangup. Upon arrival it was determined it was a false alarm. Units cleared.

August 17, 1814

A resident on N. Belleview advised unknown people tried to open credit cards in his name through two different credit card companies. The attempt was stopped and the companies were informed of the attempt.



August 17, 1830

Units responded into the area of Lakeview Dr. on a report of a dog at large. The dog was located and taken back to the address that was on the dog's collar. The dog's gate was found open. The dog was returned to its yard and the gate was secured. A door hanger was left .

August 18, 0230

Units responded to Sable Ridge on a report of a runaway juvenile. Police learned a 15 year old juvenile had used her parent's credit card to secure a ride to Columbus, Ohio and bought a flight to Las Vegas. Police units coordinated efforts with Southwest Airlines and Las Vegas PD to secure the child and to have her sent home. The juveniles parents will pick their daughter up when she returns on a flight to Ohio, and bring her to Bellbrook PD and then onto juvenile detention.
