### **October 2, 2017 – 0051 hours**

An officer located a female passed out behind the wheel of a running vehicle that was parked at a business on State Route 725. Further investigation led to the arrest of a 35-year old female from Centerville for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence. The suspect was later released.

### **October 2, 2017 – 0545 hours**

An officer was dispatched to West Franklin Street on the report of a traffic hazard. A water main break was found to be the cause of the hazard. The Bellbrook Service Department was notified.

### **October 2, 2017 – 0653 hours**

A dispute was reported on West Franklin Street. Investigation revealed that an argument had ensued between a landlord and his tenants. All parties were separated and spoken with. Report taken.

### **October 2, 2017 – 0800 hours**

A resident on Tampico Trail reported that an unknown subject had used his credit card information for a purchase at a business in Columbus. The bank was contacted and the credit card account was closed.

### **October 5, 2017 – 0333 hours**

A vehicle was stopped on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Drugs and multiple drug pipes were located inside the vehicle. The driver, a 25-year old male from Xenia was found to be impaired. He admitted to smoking meth a few hours earlier.



The driver was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence, Possession of Criminal Tools, Possession of Drugs, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Failure to Dim. The driver was released to a relative. A passenger in the vehicle, a 22-year old female from Xenia was found in the possession of a drug pipe. She told officers she had smoked meth a few hours earlier. The female was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Possession of Criminal Tools.

**October 5, 2017 – 1058 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington Pike after a routine registration check revealed that the license plates did not belong on the car. Contact with the driver, a 56-year old male from Troy, revealed that he did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Fictitious Registration.

**October 5, 2017 – 1200 hours**

A 17-year old male juvenile was arrested after making threats to a 14-year old juvenile. The suspect was charged with three counts of Aggravated Menacing and transported to the Greene County Juvenile Detention Center.

**October 5, 2017 – 1759 hours**

A traffic accident was reported on West Franklin Street at South Linda Drive. The driver at-fault, a 28-year old female from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Maintain Assured Clear Distance after striking a vehicle stopped at a red traffic light.

**October 6, 2017 – 0433 hours**

An officer was dispatched to North Belleview Drive on the report of a traffic hazard. Upon arrival the officer located a fallen tree that was blocking the roadway. The Bellbrook Service Department was dispatched to remove the tree from the roadway.
