October 7, 2017 – 0123 hours

While on routine patrol, an officer observed a vehicle drive over a parking lot curb at a business on State Route 725. Investigation revealed that the 25-year old male driver from Huber Heights was impaired. The suspect was taken into custody for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence and transported to the Greene County Jail.

October 7, 2017 – 0038 hours

An officer was dispatched to Tareyton Drive on the report of a loud party. Upon arrival the officer could hear loud music and singing coming from a residence. Contact was made with the homeowner who was given a verbal warning.

October 8, 2017 – 0925 hours

A resident on Cabernet Way reported that an unknown subject had stolen a wallet from his unlocked vehicle during the overnight hours. Report taken.

October 8, 2017 – 1132 hours

A traffic accident with injuries was reported on West Maple Street. Investigation revealed that a medical condition had caused the driver at-fault, a 62-year old male from Bellbrook, to strike another vehicle. The man was transported to the hospital.

October 8, 2017 – 1715 hours

A theft from a vehicle was reported on North Sheffield Drive. The complainant advised that during the overnight hours an unknown subject had entered her unlocked vehicle and a GPS had been stolen. Report taken.

October 9, 2017 – 0519 hours

A traffic accident was reported on Shadowood Circle. The driver at-fault, a 33-year old male from Miamisburg, had struck a parked vehicle. The driver was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Control.



October 9, 2017 – 1004 hours

An officer was dispatched to Knob Hill Drive where a resident had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

October 9, 2017 – 1516 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on State Route 725 for a registration violation. Investigation revealed that the 36-year old male driver from Bellbrook did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Expired Operator's License. The driver was issued a warning for Expired Registration.

October 9, 2017 – 1528 hours

An officer was dispatched to the parking lot of a business on State Route 725 where a truck had struck a light pole. The vehicle was towed from the scene.

October 9, 2017 – 2327 hours

Officers were dispatched to Wilmington-Dayton Road on the report of a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that contractors working on the home had accidentally set off the alarm.

October 10, 2017 – 1341 hours

A resident on Ryder Court reported receiving threatening text messages from a relative. The suspect was contacted and ordered to cease all activity and contact with the complainant.

October 10, 2017 – 1510 hours

Officers were dispatched to Upper Hillside Drive on the report of a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that the alarm had accidentally been activated.



October 11, 2017 – 0730 hours

A resident on North Belleview Drive reported that his mailbox had been dented and knocked off its post. It was unclear if the mailbox was intentionally struck or had been accidentally hit by a vehicle.

October 11, 2017 – 0832 hours

An officer was dispatched on a complaint of a reckless driver weaving all over the roadway on West Franklin Street. The vehicle was stopped and investigation revealed that the driver had dropped a lighter and had also been distracted because he was playing with his car radio. The driver was given a verbal warning for Driving Habits.

October 11, 2017 – 1758 hours

A bag with prescription drugs was found in the front yard of a residence on West Franklin Street. Attempted contact with the owner of the medication was unsuccessful and the medication was destroyed by a pharmacist.

October 12, 2017 – 1433 hours

Officers were dispatched to Jacob Hills Court on the report of a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that a family member had accidentally set off the alarm.

October 13, 2017 – 0100 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a suspicious vehicle parked in front of a residence on Regent park Drive. Contact was made with the driver, a 30-year old male from Bellbrook who was picking through the trash and loading items onto the roof of his vehicle. The subject was ordered to stop his activity and advised of the City ordinance that prohibits trash picking. The subject left the area.



October 13, 2017 – 1626 hours

A bank on South Lakeman Drive reported that a subject had tried to cash a check that seemed to be counterfeit. After the suspect was confronted he quickly left the business. Local banks were notified of the incident. The case is under investigation.
