December 3, 2017 – 0131 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle after it was reported that the driver was intoxicated. Subsequent investigation led to the arrest of a 47-year old male from Bellbrook for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence.

December 3, 2017 – 0205 hours

An officer assisted the Beavercreek Police Department with a large fight on Towne Drive. The officer stood by until no longer needed.

December 3, 2017 – 1034 hours

Officers responded to a business on State Route 725 on a burglary alarm activation. Upon arrival, an open door was located. The building was checked and no sign of criminal activity was observed. The business owner was notified.

December 3, 2017 – 1750 hours

A resident on Kensington Drive reported having a fraudulent charge on her credit card. The bank was contacted and the victim's account was closed. The victim was reimbursed for the fraudulent charge.

December 3, 2017 – 1905 hours

An officer was dispatched to Upper Hillside Drive on the complaint of an odor of marijuana. The area was checked with negative results.

December 3, 2017 – 1951 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a disabled vehicle at the intersection of West Franklin Street and North Linda Drive. The vehicle owner was able to get his vehicle started and an officer followed him to the nearest garage.



December 4, 2017 – 0703 hours

Officers were dispatched to Sugarcreek Drive to check the welfare of an elderly resident. Upon arrival the officers found the subject who had fallen and had a head injury. The Bellbrook Fire Department transported the patient to the hospital.

December 4, 2017 – 2146 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Possum Run Road for a moving violation. Drug paraphernalia and marijuana was located inside the vehicle. The driver, a 23-year old male from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Drug Abuse, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Failure to Obey a Traffic Control Device.

December 5, 2017 – 0757 hours

Officers responded to a business on East Franklin Street on the report of a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that an employee had accidentally set off the alarm.

December 7, 2017 – 1645 hours

A hit/skip accident was reported in the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street. The suspect vehicle fled the scene. Report taken and under investigation.

December 7, 2017 – 2232 hours

Officers were dispatched to West Franklin Street on the report of a suspicious vehicle. Upon arrival the driver of the vehicle told the officers that the vehicle was disabled and that her son had left on foot to go to make a phone call at a nearby business. Upon locating the male, the subject fled from the officers and was apprehended after a short foot pursuit. The suspect, a 22-year old male from Farmington, New Hampshire was under the influence of drugs. He lied to officers about his identity. The suspect was taken into custody and charged with Obstructing Official Business, Falsification, Resisting Arrest, Disorderly Conduct by Intoxication, and Drug Abuse. The suspect was transported the Greene County Jail.



December 7, 2017 – 2323 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Ryder Court. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. Both parties were separated and the male involved in the dispute left the residence.

December 8, 2017 – 1824 hours

A car in the ditch was reported on Bonniedale Drive. The vehicle owner was able to get the vehicle back on the roadway. The homeowner whose yard was damaged was contacted by the driver to make arrangement to fix the yard.
