January 28, 2018 – 0835 hours

A traffic accident was reported on West Franklin Street. A vehicle traveling Westbound on West Franklin Street lost control of the vehicle, drove over a curb and crashed near Rosecrest Drive.

January 28, 2018 – 2020 hours

A resident on Little Sugarcreek Drive reported a theft from an unlocked vehicle. The incident was documented.

January 29, 2018 – 0144 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. A drug pipe was found inside the vehicle during subsequent investigation. The 22-year old male driver from Centerville was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and Defective Exhaust.

January 29, 2018 – 0822 hours

An officer was dispatched to Wentworth Village Drive where a female had locked her keys in her car. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

January 30, 2018 – 1542 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street after a routine registration check revealed that the 31-year old male driver from Xenia did not have a valid driver's license. The driver was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

January 30, 2017 – 1624 hours

Two unlicensed and inoperable vehicles were located on Hoop Court. The vehicle owner was given ten days to correct the problem. A follow up two days later revealed that the vehicle owner had contacted a charity organization to donate the vehicles and was waiting for the vehicles to be towed from the residence.



January 31, 2018 – 1240 hours

A 17-year old male was arrested on East South Street on a probation violation. The subject was transported to the Greene County Juvenile Detention Center.

January 31, 2018 – 1536 hours

An officer assisted a female who had locked her keys in her vehicle at a business on East Franklin Street. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

February 1, 2018 – 0438 hours

Officers were informed of an unconscious subject at a business on State Route 725. The subject had overdosed on drugs and was transported to the hospital. The 28-year old male from Dayton was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Inducing Panic, Drug Abuse, and Disorderly Conduct by Public Intoxication. Felony charges are pending.

February 1, 2018 – 1414 hours

Officers were dispatched to Poston Drive on a burglary alarm activation. The exterior of the home checked secure without any signs of criminal activity. The homeowner was notified.

February 1, 2018 – 1543 hours

A school bus violation was reported on Sugar Run Trail. A 34-year old female from Xenia had failed to stop for the school bus as it was unloading students while the school bus lights were activated. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court.

February 2, 2018 – 0320 hours

An officer assisted a stranded motorist whose vehicle had run out of gasoline on West Franklin Street. The officer transported the driver to a gas station to get gasoline and then back to his vehicle.



February 2, 2018 – 1811 hours

Officers were dispatched to check the welfare of a subject who appeared asleep while behind the wheel of vehicle on Ambridge Drive. When officers arrived on scene they observed the driver slouched over the steering wheel. The vehicle was in reverse but the driver was applying the brakes. The officer yelled at the driver to put the vehicle in park. The vehicle started rolling back and almost hit the officer's cruiser. The driver, a 57-year old male from Bellbrook was impaired. The subject was arrested and charged with Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence. The suspect was later released to a relative.
