**March 18, 2018 – 1252 hours**

A resident on Clarkston Drive reported that she had found a recording on her security system of an unknown male walking through her yard. Investigation revealed that the male subject was a resident from Caudell Drive looking for his lost dog.

**March 18, 2018 – 1453 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Sullivan Drive on a panic alarm activation. Contact was made with the homeowner who advised she had accidentally set off the alarm.

**March 18, 2018 – 1720 hours**

A traffic accident was reported on Bellemeade Drive. A vehicle turning onto Bellemeade Drive from Wilmington-Dayton Road lost control, causing it to drive through a wooden fence until it finally came to a stop in a yard. Officers responded to Streamview Court on a burglary alarm activation. Upon arrival the officers found the front door to a residence standing open. The residence was checked without any signs of criminal activity. Investigation revealed that wind may have blown the door open.

A resident on Fowler Drive reported that she was being harassed by an ex-boyfriend. The victim did not want to pursue charges. Report taken.
