April 1, 2018 – 0153 hours

While checking the area on Kensington Drive for a report of shots fired, officers located a suspicious vehicle. Investigation revealed that the driver, a 30-year old male from Dayton was in possession of marijuana. He was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Drug Abuse. A 21-year old female passenger from Bellbrook threw an open beer can out of the vehicle while officers approached the vehicle. The female was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Possession of an Open Container in a Motor Vehicle. The report of shots fired was unfounded.

April 1, 2018 – 1206 hours

A traffic accident was reported in the parking lot of a church on West Franklin Street. The drivers involved exchanged insurance information. Report taken.

April 2, 2018 – 0550 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located a vehicle with an open door on West Franklin Street. Contact was made with the owner who advised one of her children probably had left the door open. The vehicle was checked and nothing was missing from it.

April 2, 2018 – 0649 hours

An officer was dispatched to Upper Hillside Drive where a female had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

April 2, 2018 – 1402 hours

A subject reported he had locked his keys in his vehicle at a business on State Route 725. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle. Investigation revealed that the owner did not have a valid driver's license. The vehicle was left in the business parking lot.



April 2, 2018 – 1409 hours

A Bellbrook resident arrived at the police department to file a harassment report. Contact was made with the suspect who was ordered to cease all communication with the complainant.

April 2, 2018 – 1623 hours

An officer was dispatched to Fowler Drive on the report of children playing basketball in the roadway. Contact was made with a parent who was told to move the basketball hoop to his driveway.

April 2, 2018 – 2006 hours

An officer responded on a complaint of a dog running loose on State Route 725. A passerby had been able to get hold of the dog before the officer arrived. The dog did not have a collar or tags and was transported to the Greene County Animal Control shelter.

April 2, 2018 – 2056 hours

Officers were requested to respond to a business on State Route 725 for a welfare check on a disoriented male. Investigation revealed the subject was experiencing a medical emergency and transported to the hospital.

April 3, 2018 – 0655 hours

Flooding was reported on Wilmington-Dayton Road with water covering the roadway. An officer stood by until the Service Department arrived to put up "High Water" signs.

April 3, 2018 – 0950 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a traffic crash at the intersection of Wilmington Pike and State Route 725.



April 3, 2018 – 1342 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on State Route 725 after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 54-year old male suspect from Dayton was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

April 3, 2018 – 1605 hours

A burglary alarm activation was reported on Woodacre Drive. Investigation revealed a false alarm.

April 3, 2018 – 1806 hours

A resident on Marcia Drive reported that a package that was delivered to her front porch had been stolen. Report taken.

April 4, 2018 – 0213 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located power lines in the roadway on Little Sugarcreek Road due to fallen trees. The officer stood by until the Bellbrook Fire and Service Departments arrived on scene.

April 4, 2018 – 1826 hours

A resident on West Franklin Street reported that a subject known to him had removed a security camera from his home and thrown it in a trash can. The suspect, a 35-year old male from Kettering was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Criminal Mischief.

An officer responded to South Main Street where a man from Dayton had locked his keys in his vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.
