April 15, 2018 – 0212 hours

Officers were dispatched to a residence on West Maple Street on the report of an unwanted intoxicated person. Upon arrival officers located a vehicle in the driveway and made contact with the driver and passenger. Investigation revealed that the driver, an 18-year old male from Kettering, did not have a valid driver's license and had driven to Bellbrook after being in a fight in Fairborn. Both vehicle occupants appeared to be under the influence of drugs. The driver was cited for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence and Drug Abuse. The male was transported to the hospital due to the injuries he sustained during the fight in Fairborn. The passenger, a 17-year old male from Kettering was cited into Greene County Juvenile Court for Drug Abuse and Disorderly Conduct.

April 15, 2018 – 0947 hours

A parking problem was reported on South Main Street where a dump truck was blocking an alleyway. The driver was contact and the vehicle was moved.

April 15, 2018 – 1100 hours

An officer was dispatched to South Linda Drive per the request of the Riverside Police Department. The department had found a license plate in their jurisdiction that belongs to a resident from Bellbrook. Contact was made with the owner and the information was passed on.

April 16, 2018 – 2039 hours

A vehicle in a ditch was reported on Big Tree Road. The driver explained that he was experiencing mechanical problems with his vehicle. The vehicle was towed from the scene.

April 17, 2018 – 1029 hours

A resident on Shadowleaf Court reported that his vehicle had been stolen. The vehicle had been unlocked with the keys in the ignition at the time of the theft which occurred sometime during the overnight hours according to the owner. The report is under investigation.



April 17, 2018 – 1717 hours

Unwanted persons were reported on Lakeview Drive. Investigation led to officers criminally trespassing a 37-year old female from Dayton and a 42-year old male from Dayton from the property.

April 17, 2018 – 2224 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect, a 28-year old male from Xenia was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Two Headlights Required.

April 17, 2018 – 2346 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a burglary in progress at a business on Feedwire Road. The officers assisted until no longer needed.

April 18, 2018 – 0139 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for an equipment violation. The 36-year old driver from Bellbrook had two active warrants for his arrest. Due to a medical emergency, the subject was transported to the hospital and was ordered to appear in Court the next day.

April 18, 2018 – 0931 hours

An officer assisted the Bellbrook Zoning Department with an unlicensed vehicle violation on Brookwood Drive. The owner of the vehicle was given 10 days to resolve the problem.

April 19, 2018 – 1114 hours

A subject reported that she had locked her keys in her vehicle at a business on State Route 725. An officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.



April 19, 2018 – 1744 hours

A burglary was reported on Sugarcreek Drive. The complainant reported that an unknown subject had entered through a window or sliding glass door on the back of the home. Numerous items that belong to the complainant and were previously inside the residence were located in the backyard. There were also items there that do not belong to the complainant. Those items were seized. The case has been assigned to a detective.

April 20, 2018 – 1021 hours

A resident on Knoll Drive reported that someone had rummaged through his unlocked vehicle and stolen a tool from it. No suspects at this time.

April 20, 2018 – 1152 hours

Officers responded to North Belleview Drive on an open 9-1-1 line. Upon arrival it was learned that the homeowner was having a medical emergency. The resident was transported to the hospital.

April 21, 2018 – 0124 hours

An officer observed a suspicious vehicle in the parking lot of a business on East Franklin Street. Contact was made with the occupants who advised they were cleaning out the vehicle.

A credit card was found at a business on West Franklin Street. An officer was able to locate the owner and returned the property.
