April 29, 2018 – 0233 hours

An officer located a suspicious person standing next to a vehicle in the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street. Investigation revealed that the subject, a 36-year old male from Bellbrook was intoxicated and waiting for a relative to pick him up. Shortly thereafter the relative arrived and took the subject home.

April 29, 2018 – 1639 hours

Officers responded to Bellbrook Park on the report of two disorderly subjects. Upon arrival the officers located two females yelling at each other. The parties were separated and both advised that they had been in a verbal argument. No physical altercation had occurred. The subjects were told to leave the area and not have any further contact with each other. Report taken.

April 29, 2018 – 1747 hours

A driver's license was found on North Main Street. The owner was located who responded to the police department the next day to retrieve the property.

April 29, 2018 – 2134 hours

Officers were dispatched to Woodacre Drive on the report of an unknown subject in a backyard with a flashlight. Investigation revealed that a neighbor had been looking for a lost animal.



April 30, 2018 – 0529 hours

A resident on Ryder Court reported hearing strange noises outside her residence. Upon officers' arrival they noticed an animal running from the back porch of the complainant's residence. No further reports received.

April 30, 2018 – 1003 hours

A resident on North Belleview Drive reported that a rear license plate had been stolen from his vehicle. The license plate was found in a Centerville park the next day and turned over to the Centerville Police Department. There are no suspects at this time. Report taken.

April 30, 2018 – 1608 hours

A school bus driver reported that while dropping off children on West Franklin Street while the bus stop sign and lights were activated, a vehicle failed to stop for the bus. A 53-year old female from Dayton was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Stop for a School Bus.

May 1, 2018 – 1509 hours

A resident on Cabernet Way reported that a neighbor's front door was standing open. Upon arrival, officers checked the residence. There were no signs of criminal activity. The homeowner was contacted.

May 1, 2018 – 2049 hours

An officer responded to Justin Court on the report of telephone harassment. The complainant advised that he had been receiving text messages from random telephone numbers. The complainant was advised to block the senders' phone numbers. Report taken.

May 1, 2018 – 2142 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on North Main Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 63-year old male driver from Bellbrook did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.



May 2, 2018 – 1003 hours

An officer conducting a routine registration check on a vehicle traveling on North Main Street learned that the license plates on the vehicle were stolen. The vehicle was stopped and the driver, a 20-year old male from Dayton was taken into custody. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Receiving Stolen Property and Fictitious Registration.

May 2, 2018 – 1646 hours

A school bus driver reported that while dropping off children on West Franklin Street near Sugar Run Trail, a vehicle failed to stop for the school bus. The suspect, a 50-year old male from Bellbrook was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Stop for a School Bus.

May 2, 2018 – 2143 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a burglary alarm activation at a business on Wilmington Pike. Investigation revealed a false alarm and the officers returned to normal duty.

May 3, 2018 – 0038 hours

A driver backing her vehicle on Brookwood Drive failed to see a parked vehicle and struck it. The driver left the scene without reporting the accident. An officer on routine patrol noticed the suspect vehicle with heavy rear end damage on West Franklin Street and stopped it. The driver, a 16-year old female from Springboro told the officer that she had struck the vehicle on Brookwood Drive but did not report it. The female was also out past the permitted hours for a driver with a temporary driver's license. The suspect was cited into Greene County Juvenile Court for Improper Backing, Leaving the Scene of an Accident, and a Probationary License Hour Restriction violation. The suspect's parents were notified of the incident.



May 3, 2018 – 1439 hours

An officer observed a vehicle without any license plates traveling on North Main Street. The vehicle was stopped and investigation revealed that the driver, a 43-year old male from Indianapolis did not have a valid driver's license. The driver advised he had a temporary vehicle registration taped on his car but it must have blown off on his way into Ohio. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and a Display of Vehicle Registration violation.

May 3, 2018 – 1603 hours

An officer was dispatched on the report of an unlicensed vehicle parked in a driveway on Lakeview Drive. The vehicle's registration had been expired since April of 2017. The officer issued the owner a 10-day letter to correct the problem by getting proper registration for the vehicle or removing it from the driveway.

May 3, 2018 – 2004 hours

A traffic accident was reported on West Franklin Street near South Linda Drive. The complainant advised that she had slowed down to make a turn onto South Linda Drive and the vehicle behind her had failed to maintain a safe distance between the vehicles resulting in a collision. The driver at-fault had left the scene of the accident. There is no suspect at this time. The report is under investigation.

May 3, 2018 – 2041 hours

An officer was dispatched to Rosecrest Drive where a resident had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

May 4, 2018 – 0338 hours

While on routine patrol an officer located open garage doors at two neighboring residences on Lynlee Drive. Contact was made with both homeowners who confirmed that nothing was missing from the garages and re-secured the doors.



May 4, 2018 – 1411 hours

An officer responded to the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street where a resident from Bellbrook had locked his keys in his vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

May 4, 2018 – 1507 hours

An officer issued a citation to a 49-year old female from Beavercreek who had stopped for a school bus while it was dropping off children on West Franklin Street near North Linda Drive. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Failure to Stop for a School Bus.

May 4, 2018 – 1848 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business on State Route 725 on the report of a domestic dispute in progress. Investigation led to the arrest of a 36-year old male from Germantown for Domestic Violence, Assault, and Unlawful Restraint. The suspect was transported to the Greene County Jail.

May 5, 2018 – 1739 hours

A barking dog complaint was received on Vemco Drive. Contact was made with the owner who corrected the problem by taking the dog inside the residence.

May 5, 2018 – 2341 hours

Officers responded to South Linda Drive on the report of a traffic accident. A vehicle traveling on South Linda Drive lost control and veered into the ditch line south of Maxwell Drive. Investigation revealed that the 41-year old male driver from Xenia was intoxicated. The driver was taken into custody and charged with Operating a Vehicle while Under the Influence and Failure to Control.
