May 27, 2018 – 1321 hours

Officers were dispatched to Sable Ridge Drive on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that the homeowner had accidentally set off the alarm.

May 27, 2018 – 1824 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street for a moving violation.
