June 17, 2018 – 0037 hours

A hit & run accident was reported on Beechwood Drive. The suspect, a 29-year old male from Dayton was later located and cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Leaving the Scene of an Accident.

June 18, 2018 – 1251 hours

Officers were dispatched to East Walnut Street on a report of a domestic dispute. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. The parties separated for the evening.

June 18, 2018 – 1702 hours

A private property accident was reported in the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street. The involved drivers exchanged insurance information. Report taken.

June 18, 2018 – 1839 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Firebird Drive after a routine registration check revealed that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The 26-year old male suspect from Dayton was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

June 19, 2018 – 1348 hours

An officer was dispatched to Sable Ridge Drive on the complaint of a traffic hazard. Upon arrival the officer located a vehicle that was partially parked in the roadway and not completely in the driveway. The problem was corrected by moving the vehicle into the garage.



June 20, 2018 – 1905 hours

A complaint of a reckless driver throwing beer cans from a vehicle was received on Upper Hillside Drive. The vehicle was located and stopped. A container with beer was located inside the vehicle. A passenger in the vehicle, a 29-year old male from Dayton was cited for Possession of an Open Container in a Motor Vehicle.

An unoccupied vehicle was located at Magee Park after hours. The occupants were located roaming the park and ordered to leave the area.

June 22, 2018 – 1842 hours

An officer was dispatched to a business parking lot on West Franklin Street where a 52-year old man from Dayton had locked his keys in his vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

June 23, 2018 – 1611 hours

A resident on Beryl Drive reported that an unknown subject had rummaged through his vehicle but nothing had been stolen. In addition the driver's side mirror had been broken during the incident. Report taken.



June 23, 2018 – 1856 hours

Two residents on Mill Run Lane reported that their children, aged 5 and 7 years old, had been missing for an hour and a half. All Bellbrook officers with assistance from Sugarcreek Police Department officers immediately started a search for the children. Shortly thereafter the both children were located unharmed on Lakeman Drive and returned their parents. The children were spoken to about safety when playing outside.
