### **July 8, 2018 – 0010 hours**

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a subject that was running from their officers. The subject was located on Wilmington Pike and taken into custody after learning he was a suspect in a domestic violence incident that occurred in Centerville.

### **July 8, 2018 – 2157 hours**

A resident on Bellemeade Drive reported finding a girls' bicycle. It was brought back to the police department and may be claimed after rightful ownership is established.

### **July 9, 2018 – 1354 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Cabernet Way on a report of a barking dog. The owner was advised of the complaint and the dog was taken inside the home.
