September 2, 2018 – 1238 hours

Officers were notified that a resident on Justin Court had been transported to the hospital for a gunshot wound to the hand. The subject advised he had been cleaning his guns and accidentally had discharged a firearm causing a gunshot wound to his hand. Criminal charges were declined.

September 2, 2018 – 1627 hours

A resident on Garry Drive reported a drone had been flown over her pool while her children were swimming. The owner, who resides on Bledsoe Drive was located and advised he did not realize that the persons in the pool were children. The subject apologized for the incident.

September 2, 2018 – 1851 hours

Officers were dispatched to a business parking lot on West Franklin Street on the report of a verbal dispute. Upon arrival officers made contact with a male and female who advised they had a verbal disagreement over the male purchasing a lottery ticket, but they were no longer actively arguing. Report taken.

September 2, 2018 – 2054 hours

A suspicious vehicle was reported on Sugarcreek Drive. Investigation revealed that the unoccupied vehicle belongs to a local resident and was properly parked.

September 2, 2018 – 2118 hours

A private property accident was reported in the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street. The involved parties exchanged insurance information and a report was taken.



September 3, 2018 – 1128 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department at a business on Wilmington Pike where an assault with a knife was reported. Investigation revealed a heated argument between two employees had resulted in one subject pulling a knife. Officers stood by until no longer needed.

September 4, 2018 – 1412 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Sloping Drive for a registration violation. The 30-year old driver from Springfield was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for a Display of Vehicle Registration violation and Seat Belt Required. A passenger in the vehicle, a 39-year old male from Springfield was taken into custody on a warrant from the Clark County Sheriff's Office and a second warrant from the Springfield Police Department. The wanted male was transported to the Greene County Jail to await extradition.

September 5, 2018 – 0409 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on North Main Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 21-year old driver from Kettering did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and Defective Muffler.

September 5, 2018 – 1651 hours

A welfare check was conducted on a resident on Upper Hillside Drive whose daughter was unable to contact him by phone. Contact with the resident revealed that he was okay but his phone was not working. The officer let the resident use his phone to contact his daughter and let her know there were no problems.

September 5, 2018 – 0133 hours

Officers were dispatched to Beryl Drive on a 9-1-1 hang up call. It was learned that an elderly female had fallen. Officers helped Bellbrook Medics with a lift assist.



September 6, 2018 – 0703 hours

Officers were dispatched to the parking lot of a business on West Franklin Street on the report of person who appeared to be passed out in his vehicle. Contact was made with the occupant who advised that he was resting before heading to work.

September 6, 2018 – 1923 hours

Officers responded to East South Street on a domestic dispute. The suspect had left the residence before the officers' arrival. Charges were filed against a 32-year old male from Bellbrook for Domestic Violence and Assault.

September 8, 2018 – 1936 hours

An officer was dispatched to Sugar Run Trail where a female from Washington Courthouse had locked her keys in her vehicle. Her dog was also in the car. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

September 8, 2018 – 2133 hours

An officer located a suspicious vehicle in a business parking lot on East Franklin Street. Contact with the driver revealed that a passenger in the vehicle had felt sick and asked to stop in the parking lot. The subjects left the area after speaking with the officer.
