September 16, 2018 – 0108 hours

Officers were dispatched to the area of Magee Park on the report of loud subjects. Upon arrival two intoxicated subjects were located. They advised they were walking home after spending time at a bar. The subjects were ordered to call for a ride home. They were transported without further problems.

September 16, 2018 – 2241 hours

A resident on Upper Hillside Drive requested assistance after locking his keys in his vehicle. An officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

September 17, 2018 – 0317 hours

An officer responded on the report of a suspicious person on foot on Sugarcreek Drive. A distraught female who advised she was having relationship problems was located. An officer drove her home to her residence.

September 17, 2018 – 0827 hours

An alarm activation was received at a business on West Franklin Street. Investigation revealed that the owner had accidentally set off the alarm.



September 18, 2018 – 1214 hours

A suspicious person ringing doorbells was reported on Pinegrove Drive. The subject, a tree trimmer from Springfield along with three others were located inside a truck pulling a trailer. Further investigation revealed that the trailer was stolen from Springfield. It was towed. A 25-year old male from Springfield was summonsed into Xenia Municipal Court for Receiving Stolen Property.

September 18, 2018 – 1618 hours

Officers were dispatched to the area of South Main Street near Brookwood Drive on the report of two dogs running loose in the area. Both animals were located and the owner was contacted. The owner from Hess Road was issued a written warning for Dogs at Large.

September 19, 2018 – 1250 hours

A traffic accident was reported on West Franklin Street near South Linda Drive. A subject traveling westbound on West Franklin Street failed to halt for a vehicle stopped in traffic causing a collision.

September 19, 2018 – 1500 hours

A resident on Spring Creek Circle reported that his 13-year old son was missing. Within minutes of the officers' arrival on scene, the father received a text message from his son who informed him that he was playing basketball. Officers located the juvenile at Ron Kehl Park.
