### **September 30, 2018 – 0255 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on West Franklin Street near North Linda Drive for a moving violation. Investigation revealed that the 24-year old male driver from Bellbrook was impaired. The subject was arrested and charged with Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence and Lane of Travel upon Roadways. The male was released to a relative.

### **September 30, 2018 – 1718 hours**

A burglary alarm activation was reported on Upper Hillside Drive. Investigation revealed the alarm system had malfunctioned. False alarm.

### **October 1, 2018 – 1141 hours**

Officers responded on a holdup alarm activation at a business on State Route 725. Investigation revealed an employee had accidentally set off the alarm.

### **October 1, 2018 – 1555 hours**

A 9-1-1 hang up call was received from Portage Path Drive. Investigation revealed children been playing with the phone. The parents were spoken with.

### **October 1, 2018 – 1853 hours**

An officer was flagged down by a business owner on West Franklin Street who advised an elderly male customer was lost and could not find his way home. It was learned that the 86-year old male resides in Centerville and had been reported missing by his wife. Centerville Police Department arrived on scene to escort the subject back to his home.



**October 2, 2018 – 1702 hours**

An attempted scam was reported by a resident on Wentworth Village Drive. The complainant advised he had received a call notifying him that his grandson had been in a traffic crash and was now in jail. The caller advised the complainant would have to send \$8,000.00 to get his grandson out of jail. The complainant knew this was a scam and disconnected the call. Report taken.

**October 2, 2018 – 1806 hours**

A resident reported two subjects going door-to-door passing out election information on Mill Pond Drive. The complainant told the subjects to leave the area. The subjects were gone prior to the officer's arrival.

**October 3, 2018 – 1255 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Wilmington-Dayton Road where a subject from Goodland, Florida, had locked her keys in her vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

**October 3, 2018 – 1402 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on Little Sugarcreek Road after a routine registration check revealed that the 42-year old male driver from Beaver creek did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension.

**October 5, 2018 – 0349 hours**

An officer checked on the welfare of a driver of a vehicle that had been seen swerving on the roadway and then parked at a church on West Franklin Street. The driver, a 36-year old female from Glenmont, Ohio, advised she had been driving for 24 hours. After realizing that she was too tired to drive, she had pulled into the church parking lot to rest.

**October 5, 2018 – 0515 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Tampico Trail on the report of a vehicle in the middle of the roadway causing a traffic hazard. The vehicle had jumped out of gear and rolled out of the



driveway and into the roadway. Contact was made with the vehicle owner who moved the vehicle back in the driveway.

**October 5, 2018 – 1739 hours**

A resident on Ryder Court reported that the driver's side mirror of his vehicle had been damaged while parked in his driveway during the overnight hours. The mirror's glass was found lying in the bed of his pickup truck. There are no suspects at this time.

**October 6, 2018 – 0503 hours**

A domestic dispute was reported on Pinegrove Court. Investigation revealed that the dispute had been verbal in nature. The parties were separated for the rest of the night.

**October 6, 2018 – 0850 hours**

Harassment was reported at a business on State Route 725. A female employee advised that a 22-year old from Bellbrook had repeatedly harassed her while at work. The subject had also threatened her. The suspect was located and taken into custody for Disorderly Conduct and Menacing, and transported to the Greene County Jail.

**October 6, 2018 – 1252 hours**

Officers were dispatched back to Pinegrove Court for a domestic dispute in progress. The male party had broken several items inside the residence. An officer told the male subject to leave the residence. A family member remained on scene until a ride arrived for the male. There were no charges filed due to no claims of physical violence.
