November 18, 2018 – 0219 hours

A 15-year old female was observed on foot on North Belleview Drive. The female advised she was walking to her friend's house. Contact was made with her parent who did not know the girl was not at home. The parent picked up the juvenile and was issued a curfew violation letter.

November 18, 2018 – 0450 hours

Officers assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a traffic stop on Wilmington Pike. The driver was under multiple driving suspensions. Officers stood by until no longer needed.

November 18, 2018 – 2047 hours

An officer was dispatched to a business on West Franklin Street where a man from Bellbrook had locked his keys in his vehicle. The officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

November 18, 2018 – 2311 hours

A burglary was reported on Shadowleaf Drive. There are no suspects at this time. The case has been assigned to a detective.

November 19, 2018 – 1633 hours

A domestic dispute was reported on Leicester Road. The case was forwarded to the prosecutor for review of possible criminal charges.

November 20, 2018 – 1954 hours

An officer was dispatched to Creekview Place for a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that the alarm had accidentally been set off.

November 21, 2018 – 1153 hours

A resident on Bellemeade Drive reported that someone had stolen exterior Christmas decorations during the overnight hours. There are no suspects at this time.



November 21, 2018 – 1020 hours

A resident on Lynlee Drive locked his keys in his vehicle. An officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

November 21, 2018 – 1241 hours

A male from Florida locked his keys in his vehicle on South Main Street. An officer was able to gain entry into the vehicle.

November 21, 2018 – 1931 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on North Main Street for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 20-year old female driver from Kettering did not have a valid driver's license. The vehicle registration had also expired 5 days prior. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and issued warnings for Expired Registration and Two Headlights required.

November 22, 2018 – 1920 hours

Officers were dispatched to Moss Oak Trail for a possible burglary in progress. The complainant advised she thought she had heard glass breaking and someone inside the residence. Officers checked the exterior and found no signs of forced entry. The interior revealed no signs of criminal activity or any subject(s) having been inside the home.

November 22, 2018 – 2256 hours

An unwanted subject was reported at a residence on West Franklin Street. Upon the officers' arrival, the 26-year old male was told to leave the residence which he did without any problems.

November 23, 2018 – 1116 hours

A resident on South Main Street reported that an unknown subject had kicked his vehicle during the overnight hours, leaving a large dent in the driver's side door. A license plate had



also been stolen from the vehicle. The license plate was found a few blocks away and returned to the complainant. There are no suspects at this time. Report taken.

November 23, 2018 – 1716 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on South Main Street for several equipment violations. Investigation revealed that the 51-year old male driver from Bellbrook did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension and issued warnings for Two Headlights Required, Defective Muffler and Cracked Windshield.

November 24, 2018 – 2012 hours

An officer assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with the apprehension of a shoplifting suspect on Wilmington Pike. The suspect vehicle had left at a high rate of speed and was stopped on I-675. The officer stood by until no longer needed.

November 24, 2018 – 2117 hours

An officer was dispatched to a business parking lot on State Route 725 for a suspicious vehicle that had been parked there for more than three hours. The caller believed the four occupants in the vehicle were possible using drugs. Contact was made with the driver and passengers. The driver told the officer that the vehicle had broken down and he was waiting for his brother to arrive and fix the vehicle. Investigation revealed that 1 female passenger was wanted on warrants from the Beavercreek Police Department and Clinton County. The suspect was taken into custody and transported to the Greene County Jail by a Beavercreek Police Officer. A second female passenger was wanted on warrants but outside of the extradition range. None of the subjects in the vehicle had a valid driver's license and the vehicle was towed.
