December 2, 2018 – 1138 hours

Officers responded to a business on State Route 725 on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed a cleaning crew had accidentally set off the alarm.

December 2, 2018 – 1641 hours

An officer was dispatched to Regent Park Drive near Beechwood Drive on a traffic hazard. Upon arrival the officer located a tree in the roadway. The Bellbrook Service Department was summoned to the area and removed the street obstruction.

December 2, 2018 – 1949 hours

An officer responded to Knob Hill Drive on a burglary alarm activation. The homeowner explained that the wind had blown upon his back door and set off the alarm.

December 2, 2018 – 2014 hours

Officers along with Sugarcreek Police Department officers responded to a business on State Route 725 on the report of a fight in progress. Investigation led to the arrest of two subjects. A 23-year old male from Bellbrook was arrested for Disorderly Conduct by Intoxication, Resisting Arrest, and Obstruction of Official Business. A second subject, a 27-year old male who recently moved from California to Bellbrook was charged with Disorderly Conduct by Intoxication and Obstruction of Official Business. Both suspects were transported to the Greene County Jail.

December 3, 2018 – 0609 hours

An unwanted person was reported on West Franklin Street. The suspect, a 26-year old male from Spring Valley was served a Criminal Trespass warning.



December 3, 2018 – 1207 hours

An officer was dispatched to Wilmington-Dayton Road to check the welfare of an elderly female walking in the roadway. The 67-year old woman from Dayton was disoriented and said she was walking to Englewood. After several unsuccessful attempts to have a family member pick up the woman, the officer transported the female to her residence in Dayton.

December 3, 2018 – 2220 hours

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 30-year old driver from Waynesville did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for driving under an OVI suspension and given a verbal warning for No Tail Lights.

December 4, 2018 – 1517 hours

A business requested a welfare check on a subject who had been sitting in a parked vehicle in their lot. Investigation revealed that the 42-year old female driver was sleep deprived and transported to her home in Bellbrook.

December 5, 2018 – 0846 hours

A resident on Hillrise Circle reported that someone had removed the license plates of her vehicle and placed other license plates on it. The plates that had been put on the vehicle were stolen out of Springfield. Report taken.

December 7, 2018 – 2303 hours

A vehicle was stopped on State Route 725 for a turn signal violation. Investigation revealed that the 56-year old male driver from Franklin was impaired. The suspect was taken into custody and charged with Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence and Failure to Signal a Turn.



December 8, 2018 – 0602 hours

An officer assisted the Sugarcreek Township Police Department with a disabled vehicle at a business on Wilmington Pike. Investigation led to the arrest of the driver for Operating a Vehicle while under the Influence.

December 8, 2018 – 1013 hours

An officer responded to Jacob Hills Court on a burglary alarm activation. Investigation revealed that a cleaning crew had accidentally set off the alarm.

December 8, 2018 – 2005 hours

A welfare check on a 26-year old female who resides on North Main Street was requested after a relative had not heard from her for 2 weeks. Officers responded to the residence but found no one at home. The exterior of the home checked secure. The female called the police department a few hours later and advised she was ok.
