**December 10, 2018 – 0527 hours**

An officer stopped a vehicle on Wilmington-Dayton Road for an equipment violation. Investigation revealed that the 31-year old male from Lima did not have a valid driver's license. The vehicle registration was expired. The suspect was cited into Xenia Municipal Court for Driving under Suspension, Expired Registration, and Two Headlights Required.

**December 10, 2018 – 1200 hours**

A resident on Firebird Drive reported that the front license plate of her vehicle had been stolen. There were clear pry marks on the front bumper. Report taken.

**December 10, 2018 – 2255 hours**

An officer located a vehicle in Bellbrook Park after hours. Contact with the driver revealed that he had a headache. The officer explained that the park was closed and the male from Miamisburg left the area.

**December 12, 2018 – 1059 hours**

Officers were dispatched on the report of a suspicious male in a backyard on Ivy Crest. Investigation revealed that the subject was working on the neighbor's home and had been in the backyard of the residence in question.

**December 12, 2018 – 1327 hours**

A resident on Portage Path reported receiving two phone calls from a subject in New York who advised her she owes taxes. The caller advised that the police department would be contacted if the complainant did not call back. The officer explained to that this is a known scam and to ignore any future calls.



**December 12, 2018 – 1656 hours**

An officer was dispatched to Vemco Drive for a water problem. It was learned that an exterior faucet was flowing water. The officer unsuccessfully attempted to turn off the water. The officer was unable to make contact with the homeowner. The Bellbrook Service Department responded and shut off the water to the residence.

**December 12, 2018 – 1941 hours**

Officers responded to Sugarcreek Drive for a requested welfare check on two children. The caller advised she was concerned that their parent could be intoxicated. Contact was made with the parent and children and all checked ok.

**December 12, 2018 – 2040 hours**

A 9-1-1 hang up call was received from Cabernet Way. Investigation revealed a child had been playing with the telephone.

**December 14, 2018 – 1659 hours**

A resident on Plantation Trail reported that she was trying to sell a cellular phone online and had given information about the phone to a potential buyer. She never heard from the interested party again. She then discovered that the same subject was attempting to sell her cellular phone on the internet. The complainant was still in possession of the phone and was not out of any money. Report taken.

**December 14, 2018 – 1807 hours**

An anonymous complaint of drug activity was reported on Ryder Court. The complainant advised that an odor of marijuana was coming from one of the apartments. Officers checked the area and made contact with the homeowner. The complaint was unfounded.

**December 14, 2018 – 2107 hours**

A domestic dispute was reported on Knob Hill Drive. Investigation revealed a verbal argument had occurred. There had not been any physical violence. Report taken.



**December 15, 2018 – 0138 hours**

Officers assisted the Centerville Police Department with locating a suspect in a hit/skip traffic accident on I-675. Contact was made with the driver, a 40-year old female who resides on Poston Drive. The female was found to be intoxicated and admitted she had been drinking prior to the crash. The suspect was taken into custody and turned over to the Centerville Police Department.
