December 16, 2018 – 1142 hours

Telephone harassment was reported by a resident on South Main Street. The suspect was contacted and ordered to refrain from any future communication with the complainant.

December 17, 2018 – 0106 hours

A resident on Plantation Trail reported hearing a suspicious noise at her front door. The home and area were checked. The complaint was unfounded.
