November 3, 2019 – 0223 hours

Officers were dispatched to a residence on Cedar Ct. for a welfare check on a family member. Bellbrook medics arrived on scene and then transported the family member to the hospital.

November 3, 2019 – 1208 hours

An officer was dispatched to the area of Belair for a dog on dog attack. The officer met with an officer from the Greene County Animal Control office. The report was turned over to the GCAC officer.

November 4, 2019 – 0356 hours

Officers responded to a residence on Ryder Ct. for a welfare check of a resident. A neighbor was hearing suspicious sounds coming from inside. Access was gained and the Bellbrook medics arrived. The resident was transported to the local hospital.

November 4, 2019 – 2533 hours

An officer was dispatched to Moss Oak for a Peace Officer stand-by.

November 5, 2019 – 0325 hours

While on patrol on Wilmington Dayton, a Bellbrook Police officer conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a one headlight violation. Further investigation revealed that the driver was under a driving suspension. The driver was cited. The driver and vehicle were released to a valid driver.

November 5, 2019 – 1124 hours

Officers were dispatched to a residence on Bledsoe for a 911 call. Further investigation showed that a medic was needed. The family members were checked and found to be fine.



November 6, 2019 – 1400 hours

An officer was dispatched to a residence on Sable Ridge for a suspicious person. The resident stated that they were approached by a person portraying as an AT&T contractor. No ID or markings on his vehicle showed AT&T. The person cut the temporary cable line outside of the residence and then left the area. No known suspect.
